


### Newsletter AE4EU - January 2022

#### A planned research and innovation partnership on agroecology in Europe

More and more grassroots organisations, research institutes and other stakeholders are nowadays working towards the development of agroecology in Europe, and the world.

To encourage this dynamic, engage and gather stakeholders to support agroecology development throughout Europe, the European Commission is working with Member States, Associated Countries and a wide range of stakeholders on a proposal for a research and innovation partnership on agroecology living labs and research infrastructures. The partnership aims to

- Strengthen the agroecology research and innovation ecosystem;
- Improve farmers' knowledge on the implementation of agroecology and its benefits;
- Improve the sharing of knowledge and experience across regions and countries;
- Boost the co-creation of solutions
- Strengthen the science-policy dialogue on agroecology
- Designed around the concept of living labs and research infrastructures, the partnership would start in 2023-24.
