In order to scale up agroecology, it is critical to document and analyse its development in different contexts as a necessary step to attain significant insights about the state of the art of agroecology, as well as to support its expansion and use at the policymaker level. Based on the mapping of agroecology in different European countries, AE4EU (Agroecology for Europe) and Agroecology Europe launched the first volume of a book series that presents the latest findings on the development of agroecology in Europe.

ENAF - the story continues

In our last newsletter, we shared an invitation to the launch of the European Network for Agroecological Food Systems (ENAF) as the next step of what we previously called the 'network of networks'. The launch took place on January 26th and was attended by representatives from a wide range of networks, associations, and EU programmes.
